Have you a concern?

The health service is committed to maintaining the highest possible standards of care for patients/clients and employees are protected if they report any concerns in this regard.

Section 103 of the Health Act 2007, which came into operation on 1st March 2009, provides for the making of protected disclosures by health service employees. If an employee reports a workplace concern, in accordance with the procedures outlined in the legislation, it will be treated as a "protected disclosure". This means that an employee cannot be subjected to detrimental treatment by their employer as a result of reporting their concern. Neither are they liable for damages as a consequence of making a protected disclosure.
