



CLINICAL DIRECTIVE 09/2011

FROM: Medical Director

TO: Paramedics, Advanced Paramedics, Emergency Medical Technicians

SUBJECT: Limb Fractures

All staff should refrain from any attempt at re-aligning or re-positioning fractured limbs in an attempt to re-instate distal pulses or achieve normal anatomical alignment. Fractured limbs may be gently and carefully re-positioned to allow application of splints or other therapeutic measures.

Limb fractures with associated distal vascular or neurological compromise (absent/diminished pulse, evidence of poor perfusion, parasthesiae or motor weakness) should be considered an emergency transport (lights/sirens) and the receiving hospital must be pre-alerted.

RATIONALE:

PHECC Clinical Practice Guideline 5/6.6.5 has been amended by the Medical Advisory Group of PHECC and will shortly be disseminated by PHECC. The amendment will remove the advice to attempt re-positioning of fractures on discovering a loss of distal pulses.
