TO: Control Supervisors and Control Staff

SUBJECT: Protocols 17 and 30: Fracture with gross deformity or open fracture-BRAVO Override

Protocols 17 and 30 may lead to an ALPHA or OMEGA call determinant for an injury to a "Not Dangerous Proximal Body Area" or a "Not Dangerous Distal Body Area". ProQA instructs "If a gross deformity or open fracture is present, override to the appropriate non-referral code". In these circumstances (ie 17-ALPHA/17-OMEGA/30-ALPHA/30-OMEGA call determinant) where gross deformity or open fracture is present, the call should be upgraded to a BRAVO determinant.

RATIONALE:

Fractures that are grossly deformed carry a risk of distal limb ischaemia (ie time critical). Open fractures require prompt in hospital treatment and usually require urgent operative treatment. In both cases, an ALPHA call determinant is not appropriate. These calls should be given a BRAVO call determinant.
